Dear Asbury Family,

The time has finally come when we can start back with in-person worship services! We, of course, will begin in stages and with some protocols. For instance, for the time being, we need to limit the number of people in the sanctuary to 90 - 100. In order to give more people the opportunity to worship, we will offer two worship services each Sunday: 9:15 a.m. and 11:15 a.m. The services will be shorter than our regular services — around 30 minutes in length.

In order to plan, we will need people to reserve a spot in the sanctuary for each service. Please know that during this time, you may not be able to sit in the chair you customarily sit in. Please be patient. This is only temporary. My hope is that things will continue to improve as we follow these protocols in June and July, and possibly start back with our regular services when the new school year begins in August.

We realize that we have been more cautious than some other places of worship. As a result, we have not had the number of Covid cases and deaths that other congregations have had. I want to thank our staff and our Health and Safety Task Force for helping guide us through this challenging time. Below are the guidelines and steps we need to take to insure everyone's safety.

Temporary In-Person Worship Guidelines

Reservations Required (see below*)	100 people capacity per service
Sign-in with temperature check	Mask will be required
Restrooms open but limited	Shorter service length
No childcare provided	No congregational singing
Spaced seating	Vaccination not required but encouraged

*A reservation can be made several ways. 1) Visiting our website and clicking the Worship Reservation button, 2) Clicking the link below or 3) Calling the church office Mon-Thu between 9:00 AM – 4:00 PM. Note: Leaving voicemail does not constitute a reservation. Reservations are made only one week in advance and to be valid requires each individual's name and contact information.



JUSTICE MINISTRIES

Thank you Asbury! You rose to the challenge and heeded the call. We set the pace for house of worship participation with 126 representatives at the Jeremiah Action Rally. In total 647 participants came to bear witness to our ask of \$10 million for the Affordable Housing Trust Fund and for an investigation into how to decriminalize poverty.

The rally was just the first step as work continues to enlist the support of Mayor Van Johnson, the City Manager and District Attorney Cook-Jones. A meeting with the Mayor was scheduled for late May. Upcoming meetings include a June 8th meeting with Alderman Nick Palumbo and a June meeting with District Attorney Cook-Jones. The work has just begun.

In this our first year, YOU made the difference! No one house of worship acting alone could have brought the city leaders to the table for follow up meetings. We thank our Team Leaders Carol Anderson, Laura Armitage, Tim Burkett, Margaret Clay, Sandy Golden, Chris Kincade and Asbury members who took a leap of faith to join JUST and rally to the cause for justice in Savannah. A special prayer goes out to fellow team leader Marion Manigo. We miss you and love you.

An 'Asbury Emergency Funding Task Force' was created to help ensure no Asburian lost their home due to the pandemic.

We were thinking of and praying for you while we worked!

Please do not let pride stop you from applying to see if there might be some financial assistance available to help you through these difficult times.

Time may be running out to apply for some of these grants!

If you need financial help with your rent, mortgage, utilities and other things, please don't let pride stand in your way when there might be help just one application away.

Asbury has partnered with the experts at the non-profit Family Promise to help both individuals and families try to find financial resources that best fit your situation:

If you live in the city of Savannah, or Chatham, Effingham or Bryan county, there may be help for you through some emergency state, county and/or city grants. Again, time may be running out to apply for these grants! Do NOT delay in applying!

There is also a fund called the Asbury Community Cares Fund, given by Asburians *just* to help people in the Asbury community. This fund may be able to help you!

STEPHEN MINISTRY IS COMING TO ASBURY

Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ

(Galatians 6:2, NRSV)

Stephen Ministry began in 1975 when the Rev. Kenneth C. Haugk, Ph.D., a pastor and clinical psychologist, trained nine members of his congregation in St. Louis to be Stephen Ministers. They assisted him in providing Christian care and support to people in the congregation and community who were experiencing life difficulties.

Fast forward to today and there are more than 13,000 congregations offering Stephen Ministry as an extension of Pastoral care.

- -Stephen Ministry relates to the last half of Asbury's mission statement (grow in faith as we seek to love, serve and celebrate God, each other and our community).
- -Stephen Ministry is a proven way to organize, equip and supervise a team of congregation members called Stephen Ministers to provide confidential, high quality, one-to-one Christ-centered care to people in the congregation and the community experiencing life difficulties.

Who's involved in Stephen Ministry?

Stephen Leaders consist of church staff, church members and pastors trained to provide ongoing leadership for their Stephen Ministry. Stephen Leaders are equipped for this key role through 25 hours of training, which Candace Jenkins, Rhonda Reed, Stephen Reed and Sandra Katz just completed. Rev. Claire Marich has been a Stephen Leader for several years.

Stephen Ministers are congregation members trained by Stephen Leaders to offer care to people who are hurting. A Stephen Minister typically has one care receiver at a time. Throughout the summer we will recruit candidates for our first Stephen Minister class to begin in the fall.

Care Receivers are congregation or community members going through a crisis or life difficulty... death, divorce, cancer, financial difficulties, hospitalization, a spiritual crisis, job loss or health crisis.

We invite each of you to be a part of this ministry, whether you might consider being a Stephen Minister, or know someone needing the caring service of a Stephen Minister.
