What an unforgettable afternoon with the Savannah Ghost Pirates!

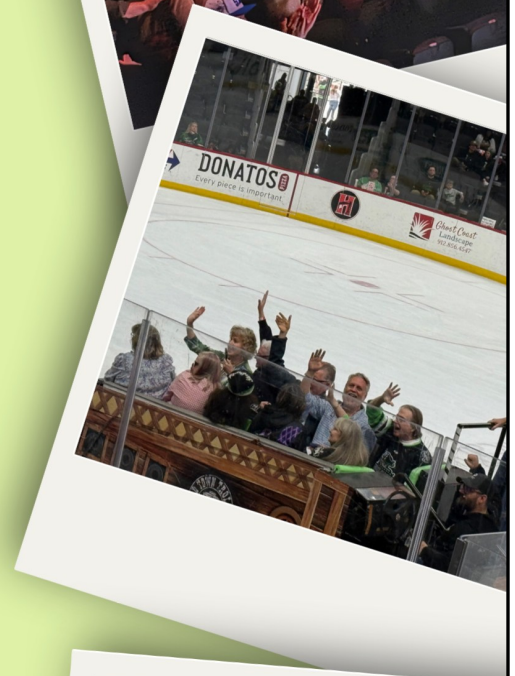
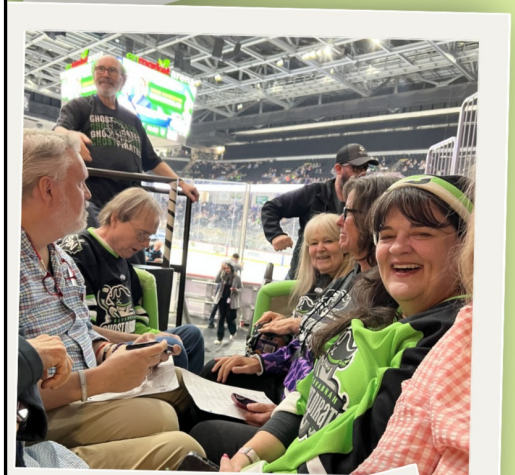
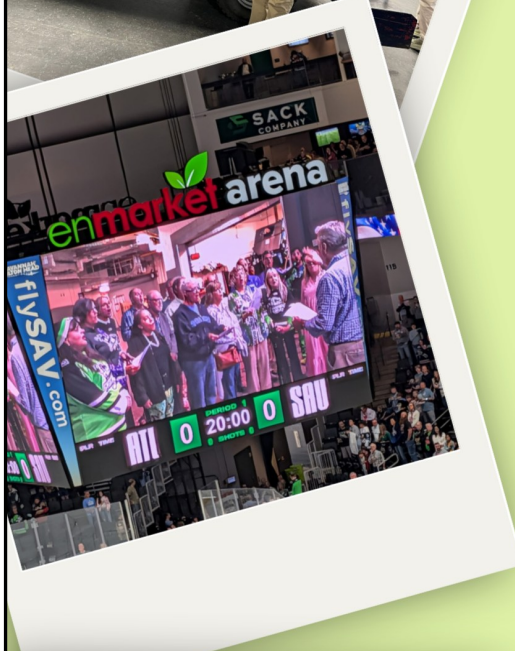
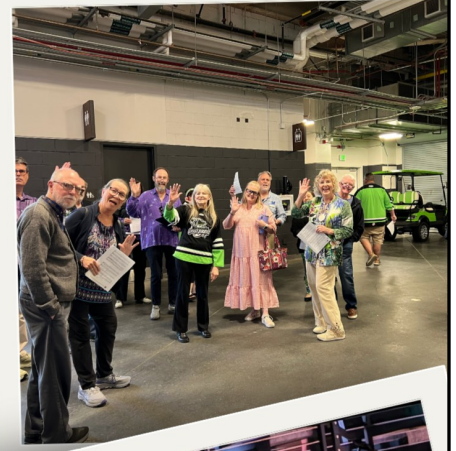

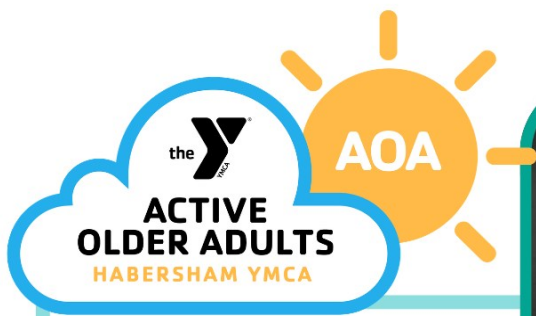
These small acts are not small at all. They are sacred. They are ways we honor the gift of creation and participate in its healing.

ROLLING THE STONE AWAY



Easter begins in the quiet, shadowed places of the story. Before the joy, before the celebration, there is a stone—heavy,

unyielding, sealing off what seemed to be the end of hope. It is not just an image from long ago, but one that feels deeply familiar in our own lives.

We all encounter stones along the way. There are the stones of fear that keep us from stepping into something new, the weight of grief that lingers longer than we expect, and the realities of injustice that can feel so deeply embedded they seem impossible to move. These are the moments when hope feels distant, when the path forward is unclear, and when we quietly wonder if anything can really change.

In the Easter story, even those closest to Jesus ask a simple, honest question: who will roll away the stone? It is a question born out of uncertainty, but also out of a willingness to show up anyway.

What unfolds is not a story of one person overcoming everything alone, but a reminder that transformation happens in ways we do not always

expect. The stone is not moved by force or certainty, but through something deeper—through love that refuses to give up, through courage that shows up even when afraid, and through community that reminds us we are never carrying the weight by ourselves.

Every act of compassion loosens what once felt immovable. Every voice raised for justice shifts what seemed firmly in place. Every time we choose connection over isolation, we take part in something larger than ourselves. This is how resurrection continues to unfold—not just as a moment in history, but as a living reality breaking through in ordinary and extraordinary ways.

At Asbury Memorial and Wesley Oak, we hold onto the truth that this kind of new life is for everyone. Especially for those who have been made to feel excluded or unseen, Easter speaks a word of belonging. The stones that divide and diminish do not have the final say.

Easter invites us to see that even the heaviest stones are not permanent. Together, through love, justice, and community, we become part of the unfolding story of new life.

And that is the quiet, powerful promise at the heart of Easter: what once felt closed is opening, and what once felt impossible is already beginning to move.

SUPPORT FOR A BALANCED LIFE

Wesley Oak Church is proud to host SMART Recovery meetings every Monday evening from 7:00–8:30 p.m. SMART Recovery is a program designed to help individuals overcome harmful habits and addictions through practical tools based on cognitive and motivational psychology and addiction research.

Unlike traditional 12-step programs, SMART takes a science-based approach that emphasizes self-reliance, self-resilience, and self-empowerment. Participants are encouraged to become the experts on their own recovery journeys, choosing strategies and supports that fit their needs. Topics may include relationships, substance use, gambling, eating, spending, and other behaviors that can impact well-being.

There is no requirement to commit to a lifetime of meetings. Instead, participants decide when and how long they wish to be involved, making SMART a flexible and welcoming community. The program also recognizes that individuals may benefit from participating in more than one support group, and it values collaboration rather than exclusivity.

Recipes to Celebrate the Season

Honey Glazed Carrots

Ingredients:

- 1 lb carrots (peeled & sliced)
- 2 tbsp butter
- 2 tbsp honey
- Salt & pepper to taste
- Fresh parsley (optional)



Instructions:

1. Boil carrots for 8–10 minutes until tender.
2. Drain and return to pan.
3. Add butter and honey; toss until coated.
4. Season with salt & pepper.
5. Garnish with parsley and serve warm.

Brown Sugar Glazed Ham

Ingredients:

- 1 fully cooked ham
- 1 cup brown sugar
- ½ cup pineapple juice
- 2 tbsp Dijon mustard



Instructions:

1. Preheat oven to 325°F.
2. Score ham surface in a diamond pattern.
3. Mix glaze ingredients and brush over ham.
4. Bake for 1.5–2 hours, basting every 30 minutes.
5. Let rest before slicing.

Easter Lemon Cupcakes

Ingredients:

- 1 box vanilla cake mix
- 1 tbsp lemon zest
- ½ cup lemon juice
- 1 container vanilla frosting
- Pastel sprinkles



Instructions:

1. Prepare cake mix as directed, adding lemon zest and juice.
2. Bake and cool completely.
3. Frost and decorate with sprinkles.

Deviled Eggs (Classic & Creamy)

Ingredients:

- 6 hard-boiled eggs
- 3 tbsp mayonnaise
- 1 tsp mustard
- 1 tsp vinegar
- Salt, pepper, paprika



Instructions:

1. Slice eggs in half and remove yolks.
2. Mash yolks with mayo, mustard, and vinegar.
3. Season to taste.
4. Spoon or pipe back into whites.
5. Sprinkle with paprika

Spring Strawberry Spinach Salad

Ingredients:

- 4 cups fresh spinach
- 1 cup sliced strawberries
- ½ cup feta cheese
- ½ cup candied pecans
- Balsamic vinaigrette



Instructions:

1. Combine spinach and strawberries.
2. Top with feta and pecans.
3. Drizzle with vinaigrette just before serving.

Easter Bunny Snack Mix (Kid Favorite!)

Ingredients:

- 2 cups Chex cereal
- 1 tbsp mini pretzels
- 1 cup pastel M&Ms
- ½ cup white chocolate chips

Instructions:

1. Mix all ingredients in a large bowl.
2. Melt white chocolate and drizzle over mix.
3. Let set before serving.

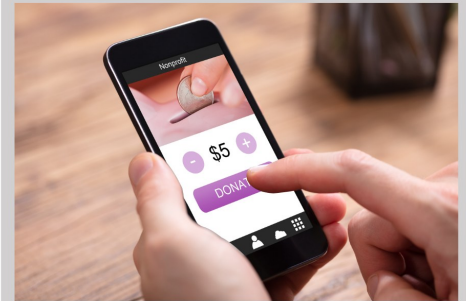
