ANNUAL ASSEMBLY

We had a great annual assembly at St. Paul's CME. I thanked the hosts for their hospitality and hope that we will be able to host an upcoming event. Thanks to all of you who attended in person and online and all of the others who held the assembly in prayer. With a wonderful spirit in the air, we had 160 people in attendance across all congregations, and with 90 votes, we chose to tackle education! We know that we have some tough fights ahead as we tackle both housing and education (and following up on court equity) but like we proved on Monday night, we can address these serious community problems when we are united together.


