## From the Desk of the Director of Joy ...

#### The Joy of Giving to Asbury

"What's the Joy in My Giving to My Church?" I thought about that question as I hung up the phone with David a while ago. I hadn't spoken to him in years - since I was his pastor. I'd been praying for him because his name was on the prayer list in that church's newsletter. I knew that he had nearly died and had been hospitalized for a long time. On our call, he told me that during his recovery, he was first bedridden, he improved a bit, and then he was confined to his wheelchair. He got better. He got out of the wheelchair but needed a walker. Then he graduated from the walker to using a cane. Now, he says, he can walk without needing any help.

But he wasn't calling to give me that happy update on his health. David wanted to thank me for being his pastor. He told me that the Sunday School class that he and others formed 35 years ago has meant so much to him. The members of the class were mostly first-time parents. They gave each other support and friendship as their children grew from toddlers to teens and beyond. The class still meets on Sunday mornings, and they've added cookouts and weekend getaways. Recently they went on a tasting tour together. He laughed and said, "Just for communion wine, you understand." I could almost see him smiling as he talked.

After the call, I felt a deep joy. The church and its people are David's extended family. They've shared so much of life together. My work at the church meant something to him. My financial gifts meant that David and his friends found a supportive community. Much of what I did, and what I gave, seemed insignificant to me years ago. But David's gratitude reminded me that my giving mattered. And in his thanks, I felt the joy of my giving.

Our gifts to our church matter to people. Our gifts offer hope, and help, and understanding, and a place to worship and learn and so much more. And our gifts matter to us, too. Our giving gives us joy, as well. I know that for sure, because I'm smiling now just thinking about David's reminder of what it means to support a church. I hope you're smiling, too. If so, that's the joy of giving.

## **STEPHEN MINISTRY UPDATE**

Since commissioning our inaugural class of 4 Stephen Ministers in March of 2022, we have Ministered to 9 Care Receivers in our church family and community.

These Care Giving relationships may last weeks, months or more, depending on when the care receiver is ready for closure.

As part of our Stephen Ministry, care receivers who are experiencing grief from the loss of a loved one receive a set of 4 books of a Journeying through Grief series, mailed at 4 pre-determined times throughout the year after the loss of a loved one. Recipients of the Journeying through Grief series may or may not be in a care receiver status with a Stephen Minister. We have ministered to 30 recipients of the Journeying through Grief series.

Book 1 - A Time to Grieve is sent 3 weeks after the loss Book 2 - Experiencing Grief is sent 3 months after the loss Book 3 - Finding Hope and Healing is sent 6 months after the loss Book 4 - Rebuilding and Remembering - is sent 11 months after the loss Each book focuses on what the person is likely to be experiencing at that point in grief, offering understanding, empathy, compassion, and hope.

In June of this year, we will complete our second class of Stephen Minister Training and commission 6 Stephen Ministers to serve our congregation and the community.
