St. Patrick's Day: A Celebration of Irish Heritage and Culture

St. Patrick's Day, observed annually on March 17, is a cultural and religious holiday that honors St. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland. What began as a solemn feast day has evolved into a global celebration of Irish culture, filled with parades, music, dancing, and a sea of green attire.

The Origins of St. Patrick's Day






