Our Financial Gifts Support Our Stephen Ministry

Perhaps you've heard about our church's Stephen Ministry, but you might not know what this program does. Stephen Ministry is a national organization that began in a church 50 years ago in St. Louis. Members of churches all across the world, in many denominations, are trained as Stephen Ministers and give caring support to persons in their communities in need. The motto of Stephen Ministry is: "Christ Caring for People Through People."

On its website, Stephen Ministry introduces "Megan," a woman in her early 30s from another city, who tells about the difference her Stephen Minister made in her life. Alone and distressed in a new place after a difficult breakup, Megan asked her pastor for some help. She was introduced to her Stephen Ministry caregiver, about whom Megan says this: "What I needed most was her unconditional love — to know that no matter what I shared with her, no matter what I had done, she cared for me. Her care showed God's love for me. It was the tangible expression of God's love in my Stephen Minister that changed my life."

Asbury Memorial Church became a Stephen Ministry congregation in 2021, by training 5 Stephen Ministry leaders to supervise the program, and also training an additional 4 other Asbury members as Stephen Ministers. Now trained and regularly supervised, these members have provided spiritual companionship to 8 people in need of support. Their relationships are safe, confidential, and compassionate. The Stephen Minister's relationship with someone can last as long as necessary. Currently 6 more Stephen Ministers are being trained as caregivers.

In addition to personal crisis support, the Stephen Ministry also provides GRIEF books during the year following the loss of a loved one. Already 30 people have received these books and have expressed their heart-felt gratitude for the church's support.

Our financial support of our church, through our gifts to its budget, paid for the start-up costs of our Stephen Ministry, as well as for the trainings, supervision, and materials like the GRIEF books. Our giving makes a real difference in the lives of hurting people. Thank you for your generosity. I'm glad to know that my dollars positively impact the lives of real people. I hope you're glad, too!

The Abasys have just celebrated their high holidays, making a strong connection with their mosque and their neighbors.

Hasiba is on the road to a career - Hasiba Abasy has overcome amazing obstacles to pass the first two parts of her CNA study course. She is one of only five people in her class to accomplish this AND the only person to do so in a secondary language. Less than a year ago, Hasiba had no English, and look at what she has done! She has passed the written and lab portions of her class and now will be tested on practical clinical skills in the field next week. After passing her course, she will need to pass a state exam for credentialing. She is slated to start work at Hospice of Savannah, which has been a sponsor and support of her efforts along with the Abasys' tutoring team.

**Hameed's employment -** Hameed's work schedule continues to be unpredictable with last-minute cancellations and low hours. Paula Avena has helped Hameed update his resume, and two congregation members are actively working with him to secure better employment.

The children are blooming - The youngest children are working at grade level or above in all areas of curriculum. Zohra just shone in her school's international night, crafting a dual presentation on Afghanistan and Pakistan and performing her first violin group recital. Zahra is showing greater enthusiasm for school. It is hardest for the older children to adapt to the rigors of more demanding curriculum in a strange language. The tutors are making a huge difference in their math and language skills as evidenced by their progress reports.

Summer needs: Transportation to summer camp - For the first time in their family life, both parents will be working this summer. There is no activity in Savannah that will accommodate learning for all of the children in one location. Zahra and Zohra will be attending ESOL studies at Georgia Southern Armstrong campus and Imran and Yusra will be going to the city's day camp at Windsor Forest, starting Tuesday, May 30, 2023, and running for 8 weeks.



#### STEPHEN MINISTRY UPDATE

Each of us has times when we are lonely, grieving, hurt, or in need of care. In his second letter to the Corinthians, Paul writes that when we suffer and are troubled, we find comfort through Christ (2 Corinthians 1:4–6)—and one of the ways we find this comfort is through other caring Christians.

Our congregation has a group of people skilled in caring for those facing challenges in their lives. These people, called Stephen Ministers, have undergone extensive training to develop and nurture their caring skills. Now our Stephen Ministers are working with people who are experiencing many different kinds of crises.

Our second class of Stephen Ministers complete training and will be commissioned in late June, and will begin their caring ministry in our congregation and community.

Who might receive care from a Stephen Minister? Care receivers may be hospitalized, grieving the death of a loved one, separated or divorcing, homebound, unemployed, adjusting to the birth of a child, or experiencing many other kinds of life difficulties. They may be members of our church, or friends, neighbors, and co-workers without any church home.

Think about your life and the lives of the people around you. Are you, or is someone you know, going through a time of crisis or challenge? The care of a Stephen Minister may be exactly what's needed to help bring Christ's healing.

Consider whether you know of someone who needs their care, and offer to connect them to this ministry. And remember our Stephen Ministry in your prayers.

#### THINK BEFORE YOU CLICK

Any message, phone call or email that persuades you to reveal your passwords, social security number, credit card numbers, or to purchase gift cards should be a matter of concern.

#### THINK BEFORE YOU CLICK

Check the from email address. Recognize it? Look suspicious? It probably is! Geek Squad sending you an invoice from shk758@gmail.com? If you receive an email from Rev. Billy Hester - verify the email address. If unsure, call or email the church office to verify

#### **UPDATE YOUR SOFTWARE**

Update the operating system on your mobile phones, tablets, and laptops to make sure you get their latest, most secure versions.

#### **USE STRONG PASSWORDS**

Make sure to use different passwords for all your apps and websites. Your master password should be strong, and you should secure your password manager account with Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA)!



Securing your wifi networks and hiding them is one of the safest things you can do for your systems. Avoid devices that can connect to your network and compromise you.

Wisdom book study with Men Friends


