How Can I Give? Part 3

Part 3: Giving Online

Maybe you've noticed, in the offering plate as you pass it to your neighbor during Sunday worship, the little green and white card that announces in big letters, "I Give Online." Since so much happens via the internet in our culture these days, it may not surprise you that approximately 75 individuals or families give their monthly support to the church electronically. No need to bring cash or send a check. Just give online!

But then perhaps you wondered: How might I do that? Is it easy, or difficult? Is it safe? Yes! It's easy, and it's safe. Here are three ways you could begin giving online.

First, if you regularly bank online, watch your balance, pay your mortgage or your rent, keep track of your checks. It's easy to instruct your bank to send your monthly offering or pledge directly to the church on your behalf.

In fact, if your bank is like mine, you will probably be able to arrange your gift to the church on the same day every month.

Second, another way to give regularly online is to set up a systematic withdrawal from your account by going to the church's website online.

Go to www.asburymemorial.org. Once on the homepage, you will find a little green arrow-shaped button marked "give now" in the upper right-hand corner of the page. That link will take you to a page titled "Online Donations." Near the bottom of that page is a section marked "Consider Recurring Donations." Here you may choose how often you want to give (one time, weekly, biweekly, monthly, or annually).

2024 STEWARDSHIP PLEDGE



Choose when you want to start and when you want to end your contributions. Or leave the end date blank, for now. You'll also need to specify the amount of your gift (one time or recurring) and designate the fund you want to support.

The next page lets you identify yourself and the account you'd like to use for your donations. It's easy, and convenient. And you're fully in control. You may change the amount or frequency of your giving at any time; just remember to save your profile at the end.

And third, one other way to set up online giving would be to call the church office (912.233.4351) and give all the necessary information over the phone. The office staff will help you arrange for your financial institution to send your donation at the amount and frequency you determine.

Again, it's easy. And you may end this arrangement or increase or decrease your giving any time you choose.

Online giving is easy and convenient, and it helps the church keep a steady cash flow income through seasonal attendance ups and downs. Online giving is an all-around winner. I'm smiling with you right now! Thanks!



On Tuesday, April 16th at the Coastal Interfaith Green Team hosting a screening of the film "Common Ground," a new film about how regenerating the world's soils has the potential to rapidly stabilize the Earth's climate and restore lost ecosystems. The film explains why transitioning to regenerative agriculture could be key in rehabilitating the planet while simultaneously creating abundant food supplies.

On Friday, April 19, the Coastal Interfaith Green Team participated in the 24th annual Earth Day Festival. Hosted by the City of Savannah Office of Sustainability, Earth Day Savannah aims to bring awareness about the crucial role healthy food, clean air and water, and global biodiversity play in supporting human health. The annual festival is Savannah's largest environmental outreach event and one of the most significant educational gatherings related to Earth Day in Georgia.



Stephen Ministers: The After People

People often ask, “What exactly is a Stephen Minister?” One way to put it is that Stephen Ministers are the *After People*.

Stephen Ministers are there:

- ... *after* the phone call you hoped you'd never get.
- ... *after* the divorce papers are served and the bottom falls out of your life.
- ... *after* the funeral, when everyone has left and the emotions you've held at bay come crashing in on you.
- ... *after* the doctor says, “I'm sorry, but there's nothing more we can do.”
- ... *after* the nursing home director shakes your hand and says, “Welcome to your new home.”
- ... *after* the last child honks the horn, waves, and drives away—and the house suddenly seems empty.
- ... *after* the gavel goes down, the handcuffs go on, and your loved one is led away.
- ... *after* the baby arrives, demanding more of you than you ever dreamed possible.
- ... *after* you find a pink slip with your final paycheck.
- ... *after* your family and friends have heard your story one too many times, but you still need to talk it out.

Stephen Ministers are the “After People.” They are ready to come alongside you—or your friends, neighbors, coworkers, or relatives—and provide comfort and support for as long *after* as needed.


