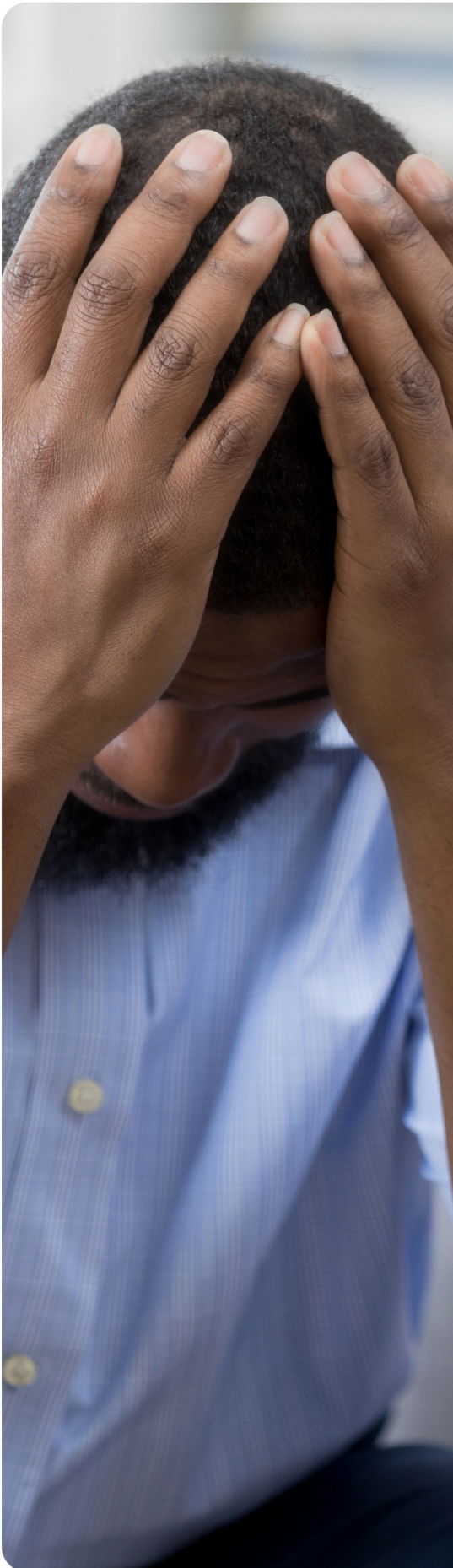

Stephen Ministry is a quiet but powerful presence within our church, offering one to one, confidential care to those who are going through a difficult time. It is built on a simple and meaningful idea. Sometimes what we need most is someone to truly listen and walk beside us.

A Stephen Minister is a trained member of our congregation who meets regularly with someone needing support. They are not there to fix problems or offer quick answers. Instead, they provide compassionate listening, encouragement, and a steady, caring presence. Whether you are navigating loss, dealing with health challenges, facing a life transition, or simply feeling overwhelmed, a Stephen Minister is there to remind you that you are not alone.

This ministry reflects the heart of who we are as a church. People caring for one another, showing up with love, and offering grace in real and tangible ways. It is about creating space for honesty, healing, and connection, without judgment or expectation.

If you or someone you know could benefit from having someone to talk to, someone who will listen and walk alongside you, Stephen Ministry is here for you. Reaching out may feel like a small step, but it can open the door to meaningful support and companionship.

SUPPORT FOR A BALANCED LIFE

Wesley Oak Church is proud to host SMART Recovery meetings every Monday evening from 7:00-8:30 p.m. SMART Recovery is a program designed to help individuals overcome harmful habits and addictions through practical tools based on cognitive and motivational psychology and addiction research.

Unlike traditional 12-step programs, SMART takes a science-based approach that emphasizes self-reliance, self-resilience, and self-empowerment. Participants are encouraged to become the experts on their own recovery journeys, choosing strategies and supports that fit their needs. Topics may include relationships, substance use, gambling, eating, spending, and other behaviors that can impact well-being.

There is no requirement to commit to a lifetime of meetings. Instead, participants decide when and how long they wish to be involved, making SMART a flexible and welcoming community. The program also recognizes that individuals may benefit from participating in more than one support group, and it values collaboration rather than exclusivity.

Strawberry Mini Cheesecakes

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup graham cracker crumbs
- 3 tbsp butter, melted
- 16 oz cream cheese, softened
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 large eggs
- 1 cup fresh strawberries, diced
- 2 tbsp sugar
- 1 tsp lemon juice

DIRECTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 325°F and line a muffin tin with paper liners.
2. Mix graham crumbs and butter. Press 1 tbsp into each liner.
3. Beat cream cheese and sugar until smooth. Add vanilla and eggs; mix until combined.
4. Spoon filling over crusts, filling liners 3/4 full.
5. Bake 18–20 minutes. Cool completely.
6. Toss strawberries with sugar and lemon juice. Spoon over cheesecakes before serving.

Lemon Blueberry Trifle

INGREDIENTS

- 1 (3.4 oz) box lemon pudding mix
- 2 cups cold milk
- 1 (12 oz) container whipped topping
- 1 (1 lb) pound cake, cubed
- 1 cup fresh blueberries
- Zest of 1 lemon (optional)

DIRECTIONS

1. Prepare pudding with milk and let thicken.
2. Fold in whipped topping.
3. In a trifle dish or large bowl, layer half of the pound cake, half of the pudding mixture, and half of the blueberries.
4. Repeat layers.
5. Top with lemon zest and extra blueberries. Chill for at least 1 hour before serving.

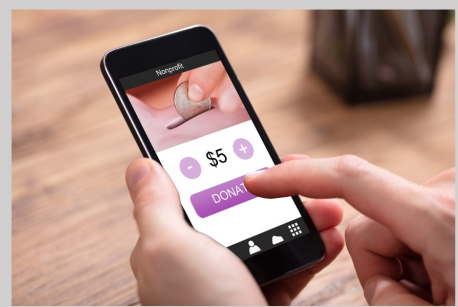
