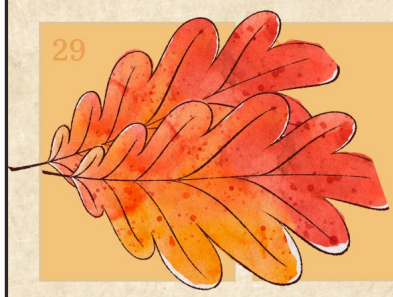

From the Desk of the Director of Joy...

What Mohammed Taught Me

On the edge of the Sahara desert in Morocco recently, our tour guide took us to visit a local farmer, named Mohammed (which is actually a very common name in Morocco.) He was glad to show us his farm. Years ago, Mohammed and his father used a divining rod to find underground water, and then he built an irrigation system. His wells have turned a little corner of the desert into a garden of Eden. His farm now supplies food and an income for him, his wife, and their children and grandchildren.

Mohammed smiled as he pointed to his various crops of beans, peas, corn, tomatoes, and all kinds of peppers. We walked through orchards with peaches, pears, oranges, lemons, and limes. He took us into a grove of date palms, and he showed us the cold, clear water from one of his two wells.

At the end of the tour, we walked back toward his house where he lives with his family. Near his house, he built pens and sheds for his sheep, goats, chickens and guineas. We passed grape vines and a plot brimming with eggplants as we got closer to his house.

Near the end of his tour, Mohammed stopped to show us a fig tree, fruit ripening on its branches, and he asked if we had questions. Just at that moment a few birds flew overhead, reminding me of how my neighbor back home has to cover his fig bush with netting to protect the fruit from birds. "Mohammed," I asked, "what do you do to protect your figs from the birds?"

He smiled at me, and said, "Well, we worked hard to bring water here for all these plants. And they produce well. Allah gives us the produce of this farm as a gift. These figs, these oranges, these dates -- all that you see here provide food for me, and for my family, and for my animals. And yes, even the figs provide for us. But the food is also for the birds. They are God's creatures, too. The birds need to eat, just as we do. Allah provides for them, with our help, of course."

In that moment, Mohammed taught me again the meaning of the word, "stewardship." He reminded me that we are all stewards of everything we have. God gives us all that we need. But remember, God is very generous. Yes, God gives us what we and our families need. And God Gives what our dependents need, and what our neighbors need.

God gives us so much. But these gifts are not meant for us to hoard; they are meant for us to share. All that we "have," belongs to us all. We are stewards. And as stewards of God's gifts, we're meant to share. Even with the birds of the air. God loves them, too -- through what we share of what God gives us. That's what Mohammed taught me.

COASTAL INTERFAITH GREEN TEAM UPDATE

Members of the Coastal Interfaith Green Team met at Lake Mayer on Saturday morning, October 7th, to ride the extensive bike trails that the City of Savannah has constructed over the last several years. Our guide was Ms. Caila Brown who is the Executive Director of Bike Walk Savannah. Caila's work at Bike Walk focuses on policies, projects, education, and events that encourage people to bike and walk instead of always relying on a car. Her goal is to create a Savannah that is equitable, safe, and connected for people of all ages and abilities.

Our group rode on the first phase of the Tide to Town bike and walking trail, the Truman Trail. In the future, trails will link Lake Mayer Park Trail Loop to the Daffin Park Trail Loop creating approximately nine miles of continuous off and on-road bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure. In addition, the Truman Trail will connect over 800 acres of park and recreation space and 18 neighborhoods.

All in all, it was a splendid way to spend a Saturday morning and envision a time when it will be possible for residents of the Southside of Savannah to bike safely to their schools and jobs in the mid-town and downtown areas.

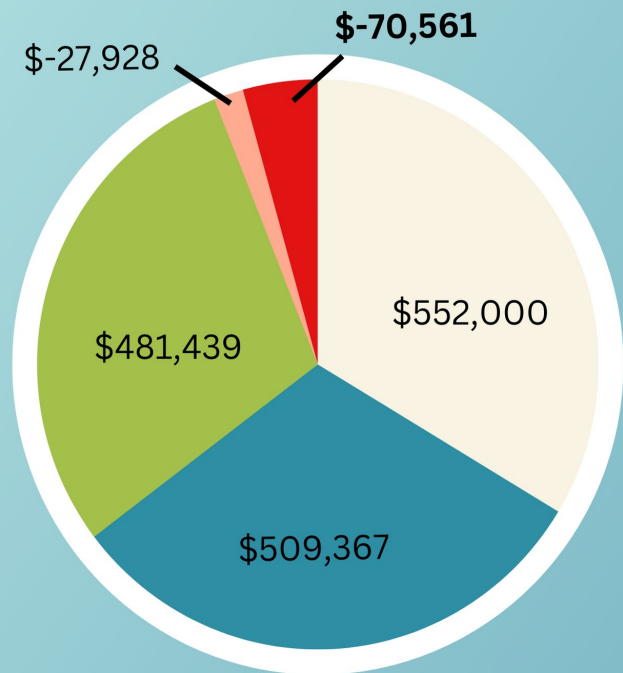

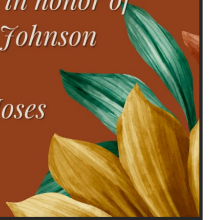

The cost is \$250.00. The funds are used for the upkeep and maintenance of the sanctuary.



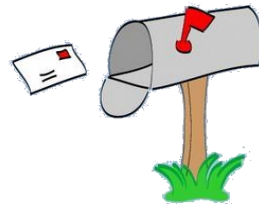

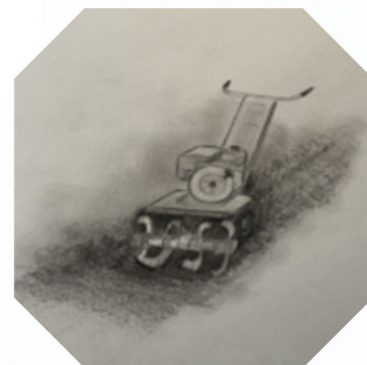

SMALL THINGS MAKE FOR UNEXPECTED JOY

It is wonderful and comforting to celebrate in the everyday stories of an unexpected joy. Jason tells the story of the Great Flood of 1993, a flood that flooded out many small towns along the Mississippi River. The small town of West Alton, population 356 of Missouri was covered in flood waters for 75 days! Jason, then a freshman of McKendree college, led a flood relief effort of students, faculty, and staff to West Alton. They needed to clear out several feet of dried mud left behind after the flood waters had receded. The dried mud was as hard as concrete, and it was toxic, so it had to go! The small town had only 1 backhoe, a large machine excavator used to pull back the dried mud. The volunteers were using shovels and minor picks to break up the mud. Things seemed impossible, hopeless, and miserable. As they were working, Jason spotted, under a nearby carport, an old tiller. Jason asked the homeowner if the tiller ran. The gruffy man replied, "that tiller's been underwater for 75 days." The man was heartbroken, frustrated,

and mad - his home had been flooded for 75 days! Well, Jason said, "I'll get it running!" So, he took off the gas tank, took off the carburetor, changed the oil, cleaned it all out and put it back together again...three pulls and it started! The man looked over and started to cry. He had lost all hope till that minute. They began to till up the hard mud around his home and around the surrounding homes! Later that same evening, the man was at the town hall telling everyone about his tiller. That tiller starting up brought the man unexpected hopeful joy. That tiller was a small and mighty miracle in the devastation of a long and destructive flood.
